Notes:

1 In accordance with the *Guidelines on the organization and method of work of the Maritime Safety Committee and the Marine Environment Protection Committee and their subsidiary bodies* (MSC-MEPC.1/Circ.4/Rev.4):

- .1 documents should be received by the Secretariat as follows¹:
 - .1 bulky documents² (those containing more than six pages) by **Friday, 3 June 2016**;
 - .2 non-bulky documents (those containing six pages or fewer) and also bulky information documents by **Friday, 1 July 2016**; and
 - .3 documents commenting on those referred to in subparagraphs .1 and .2 above and containing four pages or fewer, by **Friday, 15 July 2016** (see also paragraph 6.12.5 of the guidelines);
- .2 for reasons of economy, documents should be submitted in single spacing and be as concise as possible, and:
 - .1 all documents should include a brief summary prepared in accordance with section 6 of the above-mentioned guidelines;
 - .2 substantive documents should conclude with a summary of the action that the Sub-Committee is invited to take; and
 - .3 information documents should conclude with a summary of the information they contain;

¹ Documents other than information documents and reports from sub-committees, working, drafting, correspondence and other working groups and the Secretariat, which contain more than 20 pages, in line with paragraph 6.11 of the above-mentioned guidelines, will not be translated in their entirety. Such documents should include, for translation purposes, a summary not longer than four pages, with the technical content submitted as an annex in the language needed by working groups (i.e. English).

² In case of documents containing more than 50 pages, the provisions of paragraph 6.12.1 of the Committees' Guidelines are to be applied.

.3 the following word processing format should be observed in order to standardize presentation:

- font: Arial;
- font size: 11;
- justification: full;
- margins: 2 cm top, 2.5 cm bottom, left and right.

A template is available on the IMODOCS website for use in the preparation of documents.

To facilitate processing, documents should be submitted in Microsoft Word, preferably by email to ccc@imo.org.

2 The MSC has recommended that the sub-committees should strictly observe the provisions of the above-mentioned guidelines which, inter alia, provide that the Secretariat should strictly apply the rules concerning the submission of documents and not accept late submissions from Governments or delegations.

3 Notwithstanding the submission deadline specified in paragraph 1.1.1 above, the Chairmen of MSC and CCC have agreed to relax the submission deadline for the report of the Correspondence Group on Evaluation of Properties of Bauxite and Coal (CG) by two weeks, in order for the CG to have more time to consider the results of a research project on the properties of Bauxite, which will not become available until April 2016. Therefore, the report of the above referred CG should be received by the Secretariat by **Friday, 17 June 2016**. Consequently, any documents commenting directly on this report should be received by the Secretariat by **Friday, 29 July 2016**. All other documents submitted under agenda item 5 (Amendments to the IMSBC Code and supplements) should be submitted in accordance with the deadlines specified in paragraph 1.1.
